Reflection for this Gunday ...

Many of the greatest saints in the history of the Church were sinners who initially said 'No' to God, and who later changed their minds and said 'Yes'. St Augustine is perhaps the most obvious example, but there are many others. A person will be judged, not by a single act or stage in his life, but by his whole life. God has given us the freedom to say 'Yes' or 'No' - our 'Yes' would have no value unless we were free to say 'No'. However, we may say 'Yes' to God with our words, and 'No' to God with our deeds,. We profess to believe, but fail to translate our belief into active obedience. Words are no substitute for deeds. We must, therefore, constantly examine ourselves. We must try to turn our promises into fulfilment, and our words into deeds. Every day we can turn one of yesterday's 'Nos' into one of today's 'Yeses'.

SAINTS FOR THE WEEK

Monday Holy Guardian Angels

This celebration was placed in the Roman Calendar in 1615. Sacred Scripture is full of stories of angels coming to help Patriarchs and all. Each person has his or her Guardian Angel. Angels are God's messengers whose mission is to take care of us, to protect our way on earth, and to share with Christians the apostolic zeal to get souls closer to God. St Peter was liberated from gaol by an angel. Our Lord spoke of the angels of children who constantly behold His heavenly Father's face. Our Guardian Angels are our friends.

Tuesday Saint Thomas Cantilupe, Bishop

St Thomas Cantilupe was born of a noble family and educated at Oxford. As a priest he lectured at Oxford University and served two terms as Chancellor of the University. In 1275 he became the bishop of Hereford.

Wednesday Saint Francis of Assisi

St Francis was born at Assisi in the year 1182. He renounced his privileged family life and bound himself to God by embracing a simple lifestyle. With St Clare he laid the foundations for the establishment of the Franciscan Order. He famously said, 'Preach the gospel at all times, and, if necessary, use words.' He died in 1226.

Thursday Saint Faustina Kowalska, virgin

Born in the village of Glogowiec, near Lódź, in Poland in 1905, and dying in Krakow in 1938, St Faustina spent her short life amongst the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. In the Diary of her soul, the sanctuary of her encounter with the Lord Jesus, she herself recounts what the Lord worked in her for the benefit of all; listening to Him who is Love and Mercy she understood that no human wretchedness could measure itself against the mercy which ceaselessly pours from the heart of Christ. Canonised in 2000 by St John Paul II, the name of Faustina quickly became known around the world, thereby promoting in all the parts of the People of God, Pastors and lay faithful alike, the invocation of Divine Mercy and its credible witness in the conduct of the lives of believers.

Friday Saint Bruno, Priest First Friday, Harvest Fast Day

St Bruno was born in Cologne about 1035. Following his studies in Paris and priestly ordination, he wanted to live a life of solitude and founded the monastery of La Grande Chartreuse and the Carthusian Order of absolute contemplative life. Pope Urban II called upon his wise advice and counsel. He died in 1101.

Saturday Our Lady of the Rosary

Today's celebration was established by Pope Saint Pius V on the anniversary of the battle of Lepanto in the 16th century. Today, the celebration encourages us to know the mysteries of Christ's life and the life of Our Lady by reciting the Holy Rosary, which is a powerful tool in the fight against evil.

Pope's Prayer Intention for October—For the synod

We pray for the Church, that she may adopt listening and dialogue as a lifestyle at every level and allow herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit towards the peripheries of the world.

Season of Creation—Extract 4 from the message of Pope Francis for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

This year, the closing of the Season of Creation on 4th October, the feast of St Francis of Assisi, will coincide with the opening the Synod on Synodality. Like rivers in nature, fed by myriad tiny brooks and larger streams and rivulets, the synodal process that began in October 2021 invites all those who take part on a person or community level, to coalesce in a majestic river of reflection and renewal. The entire People of God is being invited to an immersive journey of synodal dialogue and conversion. So too, like a river basin with its many tiny and larger tributaries, the Church is a communion of countless local Churches, religious communities and associations that draw from the same shared waters. In this Season of Creation, as follows of Christ on our shared synodal journey, let us live, work and pray that our common home will teem with life once again. May the Holy Spirit once more hover over the waters and guide our efforts to 'renew the face of the earth'. *Rome, St John Lateran, 13 May 2023 Francis*
