REFLECTION FOR TODAY ...

This Sunday is a time for us to respond to Christ's call. However, before we respond too quickly, we must first ask ourselves whether we are willing to pay the cost. In the Gospel Jesus will tell us what that cost is. The Gospel makes it clear that the price of Christian commitment is detachment from the values of men. If we grab life, our grab for power, wealth, or pleasure takes possession of us. If we really accept that Christ is God's revelation to us of what it is to be a man, then we may expect rejection, failure, suffering, and sometimes even death as the test of authenticity. Nevertheless, we may be confident that we shall gain a freedom which only the sons of God can understand. It is to this personal, deliberate choice that Christ invites us in this Eucharist.

Saints for the week ...

Thursday Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Saint Osburg, Abbess or of Saint Peter Claver, Priest Friday

(c.1016) St Osburg was the first abbess of the nunnery founded by King Canute at Coventry. She worked to care for the poor and vulnerable of the city. Her cult was confirmed in the fifteenth century, but she may be a saint of a much earlier date.

(1580-1654) St Peter Claver was born at Verdú in Catalonia, Spain, and entered the Society of Jesus. In 1610 he was sent to Colombia and began his life's work among the slaves. He cared for them and baptised more than 300,000 during his thirty-three years of tireless ministry.

Blessed Agnellus of Pisa (Oxfordshire) or of Saint Egwin, Bishjop (Worcestershire) or of Our Lady on Saturday Saturday (1194-1236) Blessed Agnellus was born at Pisa, Italy, and received by St Francis himself among the Friars Minor and sent by him to open a house in Paris. He was later appointed by St Francis the first Provincial of the Order in England. Agnellus arrived at Dover in 1224 and founded houses at Canterbury and Oxford. He worked also for some time in London. At Oxford he established a school which became famous,

and it was in this city he died. His cult was confirmed in 1892. (717) The foundation of the abbey at Evesham is attributed to an eighth century Bishop of Worcester called Egwin.
