REFLECTION FOR THIS SUNDAY

The Gospel of this Second Sunday of Advent presents to us the figure of St John the Baptist, who, a famous prophecy of Isaiah says, withdrew to the desert of Judaea and, with his preaching, called the people to convert so as to be ready for the coming of the Messiah, now at hand. The Precursor of Jesus, situated between the Old Covenant and the New, is like a star that heralds the rising of the Sun, of Christ. In the Season of Advent we too are called to listen to God's voice, that cries out in the desert of the world through the Sacred Scriptures, especially when they are preached with the power of the Holy Spirit. Indeed, faith grows all the stronger the more it allows itself to be illumined by the divine word. Pope Benedict XVI

Saints for the week ...

Monday Feast of Saint Birinus, Bishop

St Birinus was sent to England by Pope Honorius I, was ordained as a bishop and established his See at Dorchester-on-Thames. He died in 650.

Tuesday Saint Nicholas, Bishop

(Fourth century) St Nicholas was born perhaps at Patara (now in turkey) and became bishop of Myra. He was imprisoned under the Emperor Diocletian and had attended the Council of Nicea which opposed the Arian Heresy. The saint's relics were later brought to Bari (Italy).

Wednesday Saint Ambrose, Bishop, Doctor of the Church

St Ambrose was born at Trier about 340. While still preparing for his own Baptism, he was chosen to be bishop of Milan. It was on this day in 374 that he was ordained bishop. He died in 397.

Thursday Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Friday Saint Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin

(1474-1548) St Juan Diego was born near what is now Mexico City and converted to Christianity in middle age. He showed a great piety and walked many miles to attend Holy Mass. While doing so on 9th December 1531, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him on Mount Tepeyac, asking that a shrine be built on the spot. The local bishop asked for a sign and Our Lady left a miraculous portrait of herself on St Juan Diego's tilma or mantle.

Saturday Saint Edmund Gennings, Priest, Martyr or of Our Lady on Saturday

(+1591) St Edmund Gennings was born in Lichfield and a convert from Protestantism, he studied and was ordained a priest in 1590. He passed on to the English Mission and was condemned to death for his priesthood the following year. He was hanged, drawn and quartered at Gray's Inn Fields, London. He was canonised in 1970.

Fundraising Meeting Held 15.11.22

Fr Jason opened the meeting with a prayer, there were approximately 20 people present.

Afternoon Tea 3.12.22

This was discussed in some detail; raffle tickets are now available to sell and members to asked to take some with them at the end of the meeting. It was agreed there would be 10 prizes in total.

1st Prize - £100

2nd Prize - £50 (this has already been donated)

An appeal for the other prizes would be made via the newsletter.

A suggestion was made to hold a couple of stalls in the room opposite the big room e.g., tombola and unwanted gifts.

An appeal was made for cakes, mince pies etc to serve on the day with tea and coffee.

Extra tables would be needed from the garage and more chairs from Alvechurch. Tables would be set with cups, saucers, plates, milk, sugar, and cakes. This would avoid people walking about with hot drinks. Volunteers were asked to give their names in at the end of the meeting if they were prepared to help.

Carol Service 7pm 20.12.22

It was agreed to try to involve the polish community and Keralan in this activity together with main members in the parish.

Schools to be approached to encourage children to take part.

Lizamon said he would enquire among his group and Maggie said she would approach Polish members that she knew.

Children could maybe take part in readings and bidding prayers.

The choir have been approached and have agreed to take part.

Fr Jason was asked if priests could encourage parishioners to attend these functions from the pulpit. Mulled wine, mince pies and hot chocolate will be served in the hall following the service.

There will be no set charge but there will be a collection for people who wish to donate.

Ideas for future events

The following ideas were put forward: - spring fayre, quiz night, social night with an Irish flavour, movie afternoon night. (Both these nights would require projector and screen being moved from the old Parish centre and installed in the hall. If anyone would be capable of doing this, would they please contact the Parish office to offer their services). Patronal Feast celebration, mass for the sick and housebound, Bingo, skittles, children's disco, and an event to celebrate the coronation in May.

Continuation of ideas raised at previous meeting

Restarting of greeters at Sunday masses – this only happens at 11am mass at present. Further action to be considered.

A discussion followed regarding getting parishioners to return to Mass, it was agreed to contact parishioners and invite them to come back, providing lifts if necessary.

Extra ordinary ministers to be recommissioned in order to take communion to housebound and it was suggested that sending a Christmas card would be a good idea.

The meeting closed with a prayer.
