Reflection for this Sunday ...

The lesson that runs through the whole of the New Testament is that you must forgive in order to be forgiven. One of the first principles laid down as we saw in the first sermon was 'Blessed are the merciful for they shall obtain mercy.' When Christ gave his disciples his own prayer, the Lord's Prayer, in the very next breath he went on to say, 'for if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. But if you do not forgive them their sins, your Father will not forgive yours.' Later on the apostle James said that if you show no mercy you will be judged without mercy. Divine and human forgiveness seem to go hand in hand.

SAINTS FOR THE WEEK

Sunday Evangelii Gaudium Day — Anniversaries Archbishop George Patrick Dwyer (1987) Sixth Archbishop of Birmingham

& Canon Peter McKenna (2000) former priest of Mount Carmel

Tuesday Saint Theodore of Canterbury, Bishop or of Saint Januarius, Bishop, Martyr

St Theodore was born at Tarsus, Turkey, about 601. He was a monk in Italy who was not ordained priest until he was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by Pope Vitalian in 666 at the age of 65. He arrived in England in 669, and for the rest of his life reorganised and reformed the life of the Church throughout the country, holding visitations and synods, establishing new dioceses and a great school at Canterbury, and reconciling divisions between those of the Celtic and those of the Roman tradition. He is remembered for his scholarship and for bringing unity and organisation to a divided church. St Theodore died in Canterbury on this day in 690.

(Fourth century) St Januarius was bishop of Benevento, Italy. He died a martyr in Naples during the persecution of Diocletian. His dried blood contained in a phial liquefies several times each year.

Wednesday Saint Andrew Kim Tae-gon, Priest, Paul Chong Ha-sang, and Companions, Martyrs

(Nineteenth century) The Christian faith was introduced into Korea during the seventeenth century through the zeal of a group of layperons. But from the very beginning, these Christians suffered under terrible persecutions which, over the course of the nineteenth century, gave the Church many martyrs. Outstanding among these was the first Korean priest and devoted pastor, Andrew Kim of Taegu, and the lay apostle, Paul Chong of Hasang. Among the Korean martyrs who struggled valiantly for Christ were bishops and priests, but for the most part they were laity, men and women, married, single, young and old.

Thursday Feast of Saint Matthew, Apostle, Evangelist

Also called Levi, he was the son of Alphaeus. He was a publican, that is, a tax collector for the Romans. His profession was hateful to the Jews. Nevertheless, our Lord called him. Matthew is one of the Twelve Apostles. The details of his evangelisation are unknown, as is of his martyrdom which perhaps took place in Persia. Tradition unanimously acknowledges him as the author of the first Gospel. His name appears among the other Apostles in the Roman Canon.

Saturday Saint Pius of Pietrelcina

(1887-1968) St Pius, better known as Padre Pio, was born in Pietrelcina in Campania, Italy, and joined the Capuchin community at Morcone. Ordained in 1910, he moved six years later to San Giovanni Rotondo in the Gargano peninsula. Bearing the wounds of Christ's Passion on his body, he became famous for his ministry in the confessional, his spiritual direction and his miracles. In 1956 he opened the 'Home to Relieve Suffering' near his friary. Despite his popularity, he faced much opposition, even from Church authorities. He was canonised in 2002.

Season of Creation—Extract 2 from the message of Pope Francis for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

The United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate change has stated that acting now with greater urgency means that we will not miss our chance to create a more sustainable and just world. We can and we must prevent the worst from happening. 'Truly, much can be done', provided we come together like so many streams, brooks and rivulets, merging finally in a mighty river to irrigate the life of our marvellous planet and our human family for generations to come. So let us join hands and take bold steps to 'Let Justice and Peace Flow' throughout our world. How can we contribute to the mighty river of justice and peace in this Season of Creation? What can we, particularly as Christian communities, do to heal our common home so that it can once again teem with life? We must do this by resolving to transform our hearts, our lifestyles, and the public policies ruling our societies. First, let us join the mighty river by transforming our hearts. This is essential for any other transformation to occur; it is that 'ecological conversation' which St John Paul II encouraged us to embrace—the renewal of our relationship with creation so that we no longer see it as an object to be exploited but cherish it instead as a sacred gift from our Creator. Furthermore, we should realise that an integral approach to respect for the environment involves four relationships; with God, with our brothers and sisters of today and tomorrow, with all of nature, and with ourselves.

Please join our **ecumenical vigil after 5pm Mass on Saturday 30th September**. This is a response to the Pope's invitation to churches around the world to join together at the same time to pray for an celebrate our natural world and marks the end of the Season of Creation. Our vigil has been organised by the parish Laudato Si group and sixth formers from St Augustine's. We will use a participative liturgy based on one created by the Diocesan Climate Action group. It starts shortly after the 5pm mass on Saturday 30th at about 6pm and lasts about 40 minutes. It should be a joyful, prayerful and thoughtful occasion which I hope many parishioners will support.
