# Reflection for this Sunday ...

This parable is addressed to the Jewish people, whom God called at an early hour, centuries ago. Now the Gentiles are also being called—with an equal right to form part of the new people of God, the Church. In both cases it is a matter of a gratuitous, unmerited, invitation; therefore, those who were the "first" to receive the call have no grounds for complaining when God calls the "last" and gives them the same reward—membership of his people. At first sight the labourers of the first hour seem to have a genuine grievance—because they do not realise that to have a job in the Lord's vineyard is a divine gift. Jesus leaves us in no doubt that although he calls us to follow different ways, all receive the same reward—heaven.

# SAINTS FOR THE WEEK

#### Tuesday Saints Cosmas and Damian, Martyrs

They were brothers from Syria. Cosmas and Damian were martyred during the persecution of Diocletian. Their names appear in the Roman Canon.

#### Wednesday Saint Vincent de Paul, Priest

(1581-1660) St Vincent was born in France. He was a priest who dedicated himself to the evangelisation of the poor, the unfortunate, and the suffering. Together with Louis de Marillac, he founded the congregation of the Daughters of Charity. He also founded the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, known as Lazarists. His life remained deeply rooted in humility despite his worldwide fame.

#### Thursday Saint Wenceslaus, Martyr or of Saints Lawrence Ruiz and Companions, Martyrs

(907-930) St Wenceslaus was Duke of Bohemia. He assumed the leadership of his country in the year 925. After many trials in governing and evangelising his people, he suffered martyrdom at the hands of his brother.

In the seventeenth century, Lawrence Ruiz and his companions shed their blood for Christ in Nagasaki, Japan. These martyrs were members of the Order of Saint Dominic. There were nine priests, two religious, two sisters, and three laymen. Among the latter was Lawrence Ruiz, a family man from the Philippines. They abundantly sowed the seed of Christianity with the example of their life and death.

# Friday Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels

#### Saturday Saint Jerome, Priest, Doctor of the Church

(340-420) St Jerome was born in Dalmatia (present day Croatia). He studied in Rome where he was baptised. He chose monastic life and went to Syria where he was ordained a priest. He went back to Rome as secretary to Pope Damasus, who commissioned him to revise the Latin text of the Bible. He went to Bethlehem to work on this project. His work is known as the Vulgate which the Church has adopted as the official version. He also wrote many other works, mostly commentaries on the books of the Bible.

#### Pope's Prayer Intention for October—For the synod

We pray for the Church, that she may adopt listening and dialogue as a lifestyle at every level and allow herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit towards the peripheries of the world.

#### Season of Creation—Extract 3 from the message of Pope Francis for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation

'Let us add also to the flow of the mighty river of justice and peace by transforming our lifestyles.' Starting from grateful wonder at the Creator and his creation, let us repent of our 'ecological sins', as my brother, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, has urged. These sins harm the world of nature and our fellow men and women. With the help of God's grace, let us adopt lifestyles marked by less waste and unnecessary consumption, especially where the processes of production are toxic and unsustainable. Let us be as mindful as we can about our habits and economic decisions so that all can thrive—our fellow men and women wherever they may be, and future generations as well. Let us co-operate in God's ongoing creation through positive choices: using resources with moderation and a joyful sobriety, disposing of and recycling waste, and making greater use of available products and services that are environmentally and socially responsible. Finally, for the mighty river to continue flowing, we must transform the public policies that govern our societies and shape the lives of young people today and tomorrow. Economic policies that promote scandalous wealth for a privileged few and degrading conditions for many others, spell the end of peace and justice. It is clear that the richer nations have contracted an 'ecological debt' that must be paid (cfr.Laudato Si',51) (5) The world leaders who will gather for the COP28 summit in Dubai from 30 Nov—12 Dec next must listen to science and institute a rapid and equitable transition to end the era of fossil fuel, and halt ecological injustice towards the poor and towards our children, who will bear the worst effects of climate change.

We would urge everyone to join us next Saturday to be part of the Worldwide Ecumenical Vigil taking placed between 5pm and 7pm in Rome, led by Pope Francis for the Season of Creation. Our local vigil will start following the 5pm Mass and include readings and hymns; please support the senior students of St Augustine' School and the Laudato Si Group in making our Vigil a prayerful and joyful event. There will a Sharing Table in the Parish Hall afterwards to which everyone is invited to bring and share a bite to eat—should you need to refrigerate any food contribution, the Parish Hall will be open between 4.30-5pm. Tea, coffee and biscuits will be provided.
