Reflection for this Sunday ...

The Gospel of this Fourth Sunday of Advent proposes to us the account of the Annunciation (Lk 1:26-38), the mystery to which we return every day in reciting the Angelus. This prayer makes us relive the decisive moment at which God knocked at Mary's heart and, having received her 'yes', began to take flesh, in her and from her. The Collect of today's Mass is the same as the one we recite at the end of the Angelus. With the Feast of Christmas imminent, we are invited to fix our gaze on the ineffable mystery that Mary treasured for nine months in her virginal womb: the mystery of God who is made man. (Pope Benedict XVI)

SAINTS FOR THIS WEEK AND THE NEXT

Tuesday Feast of Saint Stephen, the first Martyr

He was the first Christian martyr. Stoned outside Jerusalem, he died praying for his executioners. He was one of the seven deacons who helped the Apostles: he was 'filled with faith and the Holy Spirit,' and was 'full of fortitude'. The church draws a comparison between the disciple and the Master, emphasising the imitation of Christ up to the complete gift of self. His name is in the Roman Canon.

Wednesday Feast of Saint John, Apostle, Evangelist

Born in Bethsaida, he was called from mending the nets to follow Jesus. He became the Beloved Disciple of Jesus. He wrote the Fourth Gospel, three Epistles and the Apocalypse. He is the evangelist of the divinity of Christ and of fraternal love. With James, his brother, and Simon Peter, he was one of the witnesses of the Transfiguration. At the Last Supper, he leant on the Master's breast. At the foot of the Cross, Jesus entrusted his Mother to his care. John's pure life kept him very close to Jesus and Mary. In later years, under Emperor Domitian, John was exiled to the island of Patmos.

Thursday Feast of the Holy Innocents, Martyrs

The Church celebrates the memory of the small children of the neighbourhood of Bethlehem. They were put to death by Herod, who was seeking to kill Jesus. These innocent victims bear witness to Christ to a world which would not receive him.

Friday Feast of St Thomas Becket, Bishop, Martyr

(118-1170) St Thomas was born in London. After studying in Paris, he first became Chancellor to the king and then in 1162 was chosen to be Archbishop of Canterbury. He threw himself into the duties of his new office, defending the rights of the Church against Henry II. This promoted the king to exile him to France for six years. After returning to his homeland, he endured any trials and was murdered by agents of the king. St Thomas is the Patron of the Pastoral Clergy in England and Wales.

Monday Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God

Tuesday Saint Basil the Great & Saint Gregory Nazianzen, Bishops, Doctors of the Church

(330-379) St Basil was a brilliant student born of a Christian family in Caesarea, Cappadocia (Turkey). For some years, he followed the monastic way of life. He became the bishop of Caesara in 370. The monks of the Eastern Church today still follow the monastic rules which he set down.

(330-390) St Gregory was also from Cappadocia. A friend of St Basil, he too followed the monastic way of life for some years. He was ordained a priest and in 380 became bishop of Constantinople. He was called 'The Theologian' because of his great learning and his talent for oratory.


