REFLECTION FOR THIS SUNDAY

With the first Sunday of Advent a new liturgical year begins: the People of God begin again on the way to living the mystery of Christ in history. Christ is the same yesterday, today and for ever; history, instead, changes and requires constant evangelisation; it needs to be renewed from within and the only true novelty is Christ: he is its fulfilment, the luminous future of humanity and of the world. Risen from the dead, Jesus is the Lord to whom God subjects all enemies, including death itself. Advent is therefore the propitious time to awaken in our hearts the expectation of he 'who is and who was and who is to come'. Pope Benedict XVI

Saints for the week ...

Wednesday Feast of Saint Andrew, Apostle

(1st century) St Andrew was born at Bethsaida and worked as a fisherman. He is called the Protokletos or 'first called', for he was originally a disciple of St John the Baptist before following Christ and bringing with him his brother, St Peter. After Pentecost he zealously preached the gospel and was crucified at Patras, Greece. He is the patron of Scotland, where his relics were formerly venerated at St Andrews.

Thursday Feast of Saint Edmund Campion, Priest, Martyr

(1540-1581) St Edmund Campion was born in London and educated at Christ's Hospital school. He was a brilliant student at Oxford. Reconciled to the Catholic church, he passed on to Douai and then to Rome where he joined the Jesuits. Next, he worked in Bohemia, and finally for one year, on the English Mission. His extraordinary success caused him to be hunted down relentlessly. He was martyred at Tyburn. Friday First Friday

Saturday Saint Francis Xavier, Priest

(1506-1552) St Francis Zavier was born near Pamplona in what is now Spain and studied in Paris, where he became a follower of St Ignatius of Loyola. A founding member of the Society of Jesus, he tirelessly brought the Gospel to India, Borneo, Indonesia and Japan. He died of fever on Shangchuan Island in 1552 while travelling to China. He is now buried in Goa.
