

Readings: Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Psalm 94 1 Corinthians 7:32-35 Gospel Mark 1:21-28 Psalter Wk 4



Deuteronomy presents Moses as the ideal prophet (First reading). The prophet can never speak on his own authority, but speaks on behalf of God. The Jews believed that God would raise up in the last days a prophet like Moses. The early Christians regarded Jesus as the awaited prophet. His teaching was given with authority and confirmed by miracles, the sign that God was with him. In today's Gospel we see how Jesus spoke with authority, and how the ordinary people recognised this.

SAINTS FOR THIS WEEK ...

Wednesday Saint John Bosco, Priest

(1815-1888) St John Bosco founded the Salesian society, named in honour of St Francis de Sales, and the Daughters of Mary, Help of Christians. His lifework was the welfare of young boys and girls, hence the title, 'Apostle of Youth'. He had no formal system or theory of education. His methods centred on persuasion, authentic religiosity, and love for young people. He was an enlightened educator and innovator.

Saturday Saint Werburg, Abbess or of Saint Blaise, bishop, Martyr or of Saint Ansgar, bishop

or of Our Lady on Saturday

St Werburg was born in Staffordshire in the seventh century. She was tutored by her great aunt, St Etheldreda, and joined the monastic community at Ely where she later became fourth abbess. She was an influential figure in the renewal of the religious life and convent reform across England.

(Fourth century) St Blaise enjoyed widespread veneration in the Eastern and Western Churches due to many cures attributed to him. According to tradition, he was Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and was martyred under Licinius (320-324).

(801-865) St Ansgar was born in Bremen, Germany. He became know as the 'Apostle of the North' for his great evangelical work in Denmark and Sweden. He was bishop of Hamburg and then of Bremen. Pope Gregory IV appointed him as his delegate to Denmark and Sweden.
