Reflection for the Golemnity of Pentecost

The Holy Spirit is first and foremost a Creator Spirit, hence Pentecost is also a feast of creation. For us Christians, the world is the fruit of an act of love by God who has made all things and in which he rejoices because it is 'good', it is 'very good', as the creation narrative tells us (Gn 1:1-31). Consequently God is not totally Other, unnameable and obscure. God reveals himself, he has a face. God is reason, God is will, God is love, God is beauty. Faith in the Creator spirit and faith in the Spirit whom the Risen Christ gave to the Apostles and gives to each one of us are therefore inseparably united. The Gospel passage offers us a marvellous image to clarity the connection between Jesus, the Holy spirit and the Father: the Holy Spirit All of them were is portrayed as the breath of the Risen Jesus Christ. Here the Evangelist John takes up an image of the creation narrative, where it says that God breathed into the nostrils of man the breath of life (Gen 2:7). The breath of God is life. Now, the Lord breathes into our soul the new breath of life, the Holy Spirit, his most intimate essence, and in this way welcomes us into God's family. With Baptism and Confirmation

this gift was given to us specifically, and with the sacraments of the Eucharist and Penance it is continuously repeated: the Lord breathes a breath of his life into our soul. Pope Benedict XVI

Saturday Saints Charles Lwanga and Companions, Martyrs

(+1885-1887) There was a persecution of Christians out of hatred for religion in Uganda under King Mwanga. St Charles was martyred with twelve companions on 3 June 1886; others were killed later. Some of the victims, almost a hundred in all, were very young or newly baptised.

CAFOD/Laudato Si Group

One of the items the group are discussing is about the latest phase of CAFOD's Fix the Food System Campaign which focuses on small-scale farmers in developing countries who are increasingly experiencing difficulties in respect of their use of traditional seeds. For generations, these farmers have freely swapped and shared a wide variety of seeds to produce food and maintain biodiversity. However, their right to choose what seeds they use is increasingly under threat as new laws, supported by the World Bank and IMF, are introduced across the world that limit what they can do with their seeds. This increases their costs as they often have to buy commercially produced seeds with their attendant problems making life even more difficult for the. CAFOD's food campaign is urging the UK government to protect the right of farmers around the world to be able to use their own seeds.

Salina, one such small-scale farmer from Bangladesh, has written a letter to the World Bank and with CAFOD's help is asking Catholics here to support her by adding their signature. The group are hoping to hold a letter signing in the parish on the weekend of 15/16 July after Masses.
