Reflection for this Sunday...

In the Hellenistic tradition, wisdom meant philosophical speculation. In the Old Testament tradition, on the other hand, wisdom had much more mundane significance. It included a practical know-how in various areas of life as well as the knowledge of god and of good and evil. The wise person is the one knows and keeps the commandments of Yahweh. The psalm is thus linked to the first reading, for the wise person loves the commandments of God 'above fine gold', as Solomon chose wisdom rather than riches, and as Jesus in today's Gospel urges the crowd to seek the kingdom of God the way a person would spare nothing to get hold of a treasure trove or a pearl of great price. Thus, the psalm is also inked to the Gospel reading.

SAINTS FOR THE WEEK

Monday Saint Ignatius of Loyola, Priest

(1491-1556) Born in Loyola, Spain, he became a soldier. Following his conversion, he went to Paris to study theology. There he gathered his first followers. With them he founded the Society of Jesus in Rome, which is dedicated to the greater glory of God and to the service of the Church, in total obedience to the Pope.

Tuesday Saint Alphonsus Mary de'Liguori, Bishop, Doctor of the Church

(1696-1787) St Alphonsus was born in Naples, Italy, As a young man he was a lawyer, but later became a priest. He founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists). He was given the title Doctor of the Church for his writings on Moral Theology. A tireless apostle of the Eucharist and of our Blessed Mother, he worked with great zeal for the poor and the sick.

Wednesday Saint Eusebius of Vercelli, Bishop or of Saint Peter Julian Eymard, Priest

(+371) St Eusebius was born in Sardinia and brought up in Rome. Around 340 he was named Bishop of Vercelli in Piedmont. He fought staunchly against the Arian heresy which denied the divinity of Jesus Christ. The Arians tortured and exiled him.

(1811-1868) St Peter Julian Eymard was born at La Mure, Isère, France, and joined the Marist Fathers. He dedicated his life to promoting Eucharistic devotion and founded both the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament and the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament. Canonised in 1962 he is known as the 'Apostle of the Eucharist'.

Friday Saint John Mary Vianney, Priest

(1786-1859) He was born near Lyons, France, and ordained a priest in Grenoble. He was assigned to the parish of Ars-sur-Formans where he spent forty-two years. He was outstanding for his steadfast care of souls, for his spirit of prayer and mortification, but above all, for his tireless dedication to the Sacrament of Penance. He spent most of his life in the confessional, drawing energy from his intimate and constant friend-ship with our Lord in the Eucharist. Pope Pius XI declared him Patron of the Universal Clergy.

Saturday Dedication of the Basilica of St Mary Major

After the declaration of the dogma of the divine Maternity of the Blessed Virgin in the Council of Ephesus (431) Pope Sixtus III dedicated this Basilica in Rome in honour of the Mother of God. It was later called 'St Mary Major'. It is considered the oldest church in the west dedicated to the Blessed virgin Mary.

These, together with signatures from other parishes around the country, will be sent in September to CAFOD who will send them on to the UK's representative at The World Bank. Together we can make a difference for small scale farmers like Salina.
