REFLECTION FOR TODAY ...

All things belong to God, but the world and everything in it can be ruined by man's greed. Men leave pollution and desolation behind them in their search for money; they leave misery and hurt in their search for power. Zaccheus had made himself hated by his self-interest while becoming a wealthy man. Yet 'God is merciful', says the first reading, and so Jesus seeks out Zaccheus and gives him the chance to repent. Jesus seeks us out today in this Eucharist, so that we too may come to our senses and see that the material world he has given us is for all men and not only for our time. This gives us a duty as Christians to conserve, to develop, and to build for the welfare of all nations, remembering that we are merely stewards. All things will be built uip in christ, but we do not know the hour of his coming. So we get on with the job of making the world a fit place in which the people Christ can live.

Saints for the week ...

Tuesday Solemnity of All Saints Holyday of Obligation

The Church, after rejoicing yesterday with those who are in heaven, today prays for all who in the purification of purgatory await the day when they will join the company of the Saints. We can help the faithful departed through offering the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for them and prayers and suffrages.

Wednesday Commemoration of All Souls

St Cedd like Chad, was educated at Lindisfare and was bishop to the East Saxons at Bradwell, with his See at Othona. He died in 664.

Thursday Saint Martin de Porres, Religious or of Saint Winifride, Virgin

(1579-1639) St Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru, the illegitimate son of a Spanish nobleman and a former slave. He became a Dominican lay brother and was exemplary in his care for the sick, his love for the poor and his devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. (c.650) St Winifride was a native of Wales, she is said to have been the niece of St Beuno and to have been murdered by Caradog of Hawarden for refusing his amorous advances, a spring of water gushing forth on the spot where her head fell. This was the origin of Holywell, which has been a centre of pilgrimage for over a thousand years.

Friday Saint Charles Borromeo, Bishop

Anniversary of Archbishop Maurice Couve de Murville, 7th Archbishop of Birmingham (2007)

(1538-1584) St Charles Borromeo was born into a noble family at Arona, Italy. His uncle was Pope Pius IV and this ensured his quick promotion within the Church; aged only 21 he was created Cardinal Priest of Santa Prassede, although he was only ordained when in 1564 he became Archbishop of Milan. He zealously applied the teachings of the Council of Trent to his diocese, establishing seminaries and schools and renewing the life of the clergy. During the plague of 1567 he was active in the care of the sick.

MOUNT CARMEL PARISH COUNCIL & FINANCE COMMITTEE

NOTES FROM THE MEETING HELD ON SATURDAY 8TH OCTOBER 2022

The meeting was opened by Fr Jason and approximately 42 parishioners attended.

Lizomon Mapranath (member of the finance committee) read out a prepared statement regarding finance and attendance at Mass in the parish. Currently we are spending more than we are receiving in income and we need to find ways of correcting this.

Andrew Farrell (Chair of the Finance Committee) continued explaining that mass attendance has dropped from approximately 700 per week in 2019 (pre Covid) to 340 per in 2022. Consequently, weekly offerings have also decreased. Mass centres have only re-opened for a short period following Covid and are still closed at present due to Fr Tony's illness.

Andrew Farrell pointed out that copies of income and expenses accounts pre Covid and covering the last eight months were available for parishioners to see. These accounts illustrate that currently we are spending a £1000 per week more than we receive.

He continued with an appeal for more parishioners who pay tax to sign up for Gift Aid as this would increase everyone's offering by 25% at no extra cost.

Liz Hanley (Finance Committee and Chair of the Parish Council) continued that there are three ways to reduce the deficit:

- 1 Increase offerings and donations
- 2 Reduce expenditure
- 3 Fundraising

Fundraising would play an important role in building the community spirit in the church. Since the church reopened following Covid there has not been any structure put in place for a fundraising group. The Seniors' Group have been volunteering and organising fundraising events but this can't continue, we need help and a structure for a fundraising group. We are asking people who are willing to help to give their names and phone numbers and we will be in contact with them.
