Reflection for this Sunday

You might think he was attacking the Temple: religion always asking for money, and so on. But this not his point. Our Lord **loved** the Temple ('my Father's house') both as a boy and as a man. Our Lord's point was when you are giving to God, it is not the size of the gift that matters, but your disposition of heart. **God** wants us to give ourselves, all we have. It reminds us of a saying of Christ, not in any gospel, but St Paul heard it from somebody and hands it on to us: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' that is, it is better to **be** like that. We need that reminder in these days of the 'consumer society' and 'social media'. The Church at least should be like Our Lord (and Our Lady), content with necessities and ready to put 'the poor' first

SAINTS FOR THE WEEK

Monday Saint Thomas of Tours, Bishop

St Martin was born in poresent day Hungary about 316. He gave up his military career, was baptised and became a disciple of St Hilary of Poitiers. He became the bishop of Tours, France. He died in 397. He was the first non-martyr with an annual feast day in the Church's calendar. He is patron saint of priests.

Tuesday Saint Iosaphat, bishop, Martyr

St Josaphat was born in the Ukraine, of an Orthodox family about 1580. He became a Catholic though continued to celebrarte the Liturgy in the Byzantine rite. As Archbishop of Polock he worked to unite the Church. He was martyred in 1623.

Saint Albert the Great, Bishop, Doctor of the Church

St Albert was born in Lauingen, Germany, about in 1206. Following studies at Padua and Parish he entered the Dominican Order. He was an outstanding natural scientist and taught St Thomas Aquinas. He was the bishop of Regensburg. He died at Cologne in 1280.

Saint Margaret of Scotland or of Saint Gertrude or of Saint Edmund of Abingdon or of Saturday Our Lady on Saturday

(1046-1093) St Margaret was the granddaughter of King Edmund Ironside of England but was born while in exile in Hungary. In 1070 she married King Malcom III of Scotland and had 8 children, 3 of whom reigned as Kings of Scotland including King David I. Remarkable for her piety and works of charity, St Margaret co-founded Dunfermline Abbey. She is secondary patron of Scotland.

(1256-1302) St Gertrude was born in Eisleben, Germany and joined the Benedictine convent at Helfta. She showed great talent in her philosophical and literary studies but is best known for her mystical writings. She had a marked devotion to the Holy souls of Purgatory and to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which later developed into its modern form with the visions of St Margaret Mary.

(1175-1240) St Edmund was born in Abingdon, England and studied at Oxford and Paris. He lectured for a time at Oxford before becoming treasurer at Salisbury and then, in 1223, Archbishop of Canterbury. With the help of a strong team, which included St Richard of Chichester, he did much to reform ecclesiastical discipline and defend the rights of the Church. He died in 1240 at Soisy, France, while on his way to Rome, and was buried at nearby Pontigny. He gave his name to the Order of St Edmund, founded in Pontigny in 1843, and colleges at Oxford, Cambridge and Old Hall Green.

A new bill on assisted suicide has been tabled by Labour MP Kim Leadbeater and will be debated in the House of commons on Friday 29 November.
